An aperture protected by membrane in the proximal joint, and towards which the arrow points, is the auditory organ. 1 The eye-peduncles are composed of two segments, the distal one of which carries the eye itself. On the left of the specimen is a portion of the skeleton of a female, with the ventral surface turned upwards, so as to shew the openings of the oviducts on the protopodite of the third pair of ambulatory legs. The two orifices are indicated by two black arrows. The first pair of post-abdominal appendages differs from those of the male in being simple unmodified filaments. The structure of the stomach is illustrated by the two specimens...
